

MULTIPLIER EVENTS IN QAVAD COUNTRIES

During the summer, QAVAD teams held very successful Multiplier Events to spread the results of the project.

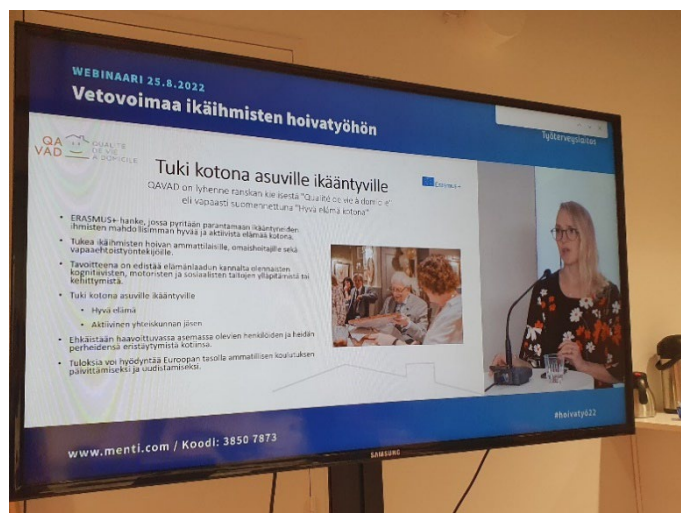


The French-Spanish Team held the Transborder Multiplier event on July the 1st in the border town of Hendaia. More than 50 participants from 25 different organizations took part in this event. QAVAD members presented the results of the project, and the programme was complemented with 2 lectures. **Laguntza Etxerat** with presented “Caring at home from the professional’s perspective” and **Matia Fundazioa** reflected on the topic of “New frameworks for the care of older people”.

The Italian partners celebrated two Multiplier events, the 5th of July in Bologna and the 15th of July in Parma, in which they also had the opportunity to present the results to an audience of over 50 people. The programs were complemented with round tables on innovation of quality care at home where relevant stakeholders took place and a keynote speech by **Fabrizia Paltrinieri** from the **Agenzia Sociale Sanitaria Regione Emilia Romagna**.



The third Multiplier event was organised by the **Finnish Institute of Occupational Health (FIOH)** in Helsinki on the 25th of August. It was an online seminar that attracted more than 800 interested participants. The full-day online event discussed more broadly at the issue of eldercare and the questions of attractiveness of the care sector through recent research. The QAVAD project and IP outputs were presented by researcher **Vilja Rydman**. During the webinar, participants also had the opportunity to pre-order the translated guide directly by email as soon as the translation is ready. Around 10% of the audience, just over 80 people, made the order.

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QAVAD is an ERASMUS+ project that seeks to work on improving the accompaniment of elderly people at home to maintain their autonomy and to provide support to carers and professionals working in the home.

QAVAD aims to promote the development or maintenance of cognitive, motor and social skills, which are essential for quality of life (socialisation, recreational activities, sports outside the home, voluntary work, cognitive workshops, etc.).

The QAVAD project will work on good practices in European countries that will be shared and transferred for the creation of shared training and technical methodology, at European level, to update and renew vocational training
